Dear Parents and Carers

I would like the students to do some active revision over the holidays in Science using a free website called isaacphysics. I have set them a variety of tasks to revise the Physics they have covered in Year 9 and 10. I have attached a sheet of symbols and formula that they will find useful.

To access the work the students need to follow these steps:

1. On the internet find <http://isaacphysics.org>
2. Login and complete your sign-up details using a valid e-mail address and password you can remember.
3. Once you've saved your details you will receive an e-mail. Log out from the site and verify this e-mail.
4. Then log back into the site and click on the menu, then click on 'my account settings', then 'teacher connections' and enter the code KAJPGT. This then connects you to me (a.smythe), then press confirm and click on 'my assignments' to see the set work.

I have set 13 assignments. This is a huge amount of work if your son/daughter does it all. I recommend that they only have a go at a few questions from each assignment and are selective. i.e. when they've got a few right they should move onto the next assignment. I don't expect them to spend days and days doing this work, a few hours would suffice. I recommend that they have a piece of paper and calculator to hand so that they can lay out the steps and that they use the attached formula sheet to help them.

I can check that the students have 'had a go' and would expect them to have all tried. I will give out some prizes when they come back to students who have clearly tried hard.

If your son/daughter wants to do more revision over the holidays I would recommend using gcsepod and the revision guides and focusing on re-visiting Year 9 and 10 topics on Chemistry and Biology.
