Health and social care

- doctors, nurses, midwives, paramedics, frontline health and social care staff including volunteers
- social workers, care workers,
- health and social care supply chain, producers and distributors of medicines and medical and personal protective equipment.

Education and childcare

- nursery and teaching staff,
- social workers and education professionals [required to keep schools open]

Key public services

- justice system, religious staff, charities and workers delivering key frontline services,
- those responsible for the management of the deceased,
- public service broadcasting

Local and national government

- administrative occupations essential to the COVID-19 response
- delivering essential public services such as the payment of benefits,

Food and other necessary goods

- food production, processing, distribution, sale and delivery
- same for other key goods (for example hygienic and veterinary medicines).

Public safety and national security

- police and support staff, Ministry of Defence civilians, contractors
- armed forces personnel
- fire and rescue service employees (including support staff),
- National Crime Agency staff,
- border security,
- prison and probation staff and
- other national security roles, including those overseas.

Transport

- air, water, road and rail passenger and freight transport
- transport systems through which supply chains pass.

Utilities, communication and financial services

- workers in banks, building societies and financial market infrastructure),
- the oil, gas, electricity and water sectors (including sewerage),
- information technology and data infrastructure sector
- primary industry supplies to continue during the COVID-19 response,
- civil nuclear, chemicals, telecommunications (including but not limited to network operations, field engineering, call centre staff, IT and data infrastructure, 999 and 111 critical services)
- postal services and delivery,
- payments providers
- waste disposal sectors.

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
