# **A HISTORY**



The Thomas Tallis Parent Teacher Association has existed in many forms. The current structure started to take shape in 2017 when we rebranded as Thomas Tallis Parent Teacher **and Friends** Association and became a **registered Charity** enabling us to apply for grants that are not available to Schools, and to claim 25% GiftAid on donations from UK tax payers.

We have worked hard to ensure our Constitution and Governing Document accurately reflect our aims and activities, and to engage effectively with both Thomas Tallis Senior Leadership Team and the Board of Governors to align the priorities of all three bodies and amplify their combined effect.

Our primary goal remains to support our whole lively and vibrant Tallis community through a programme of mentoring, fundraising and innovative, fun activities.



Last year we launched the **online PTFA Shop** on Shopify focussing on making pre-loved Uniform easily accessible for everyone. We are very grateful to the Main Reception Team for embracing this initiative and managing the day-to-day sales. Stock and Inventory and looked after by our volunteers.



We fund **workshops** and **visiting experts** where free places or travel are not available.

The **Community Garden** provides a quiet space or hands-on activity for students when they need it. It is enthusiastically supported by our volunteer **Tallis Gardeners** and student **Wildlife Gardening Clubs** under the leadership of Mr Baker.











We provide **Front of House** expertise to all School performances. The '**Big Grey Bag**' contains everything needed to run the bar and tuck shop (including card readers and float), put up signage, check tickets at the door and give out programmes, taking the pressure off teachers and making it easy to volunteer.





The **GCSE Dance** Students desperately wanted a uniform to help them feel, as well as perform as, a professional dance company and the department wanted these to be free to students. We worked with the them to find a sponsor for 2022/23 cohort and we will mentor 2023/24 classes to create and deliver their own fundraising plan.

Ten Tallis 6th Form Students volunteered at the **2023 European Youth Olympic Festival** and to keep costs down they needed to raise £200 each. We created crowdfunding and individual peer-to-peer online fundraising pages for them including their own compelling statements for why people should donate, and mentored them in event fundraising to raise money as a group. They chose for any excess funds to be used to support other students to attend trips next year.


This year we are supporting #ShopLocal by showcasing a local business every day throughout Advent.

Bidding for grants has been shown to have the biggest return on time investment of all fundraising methods. This year we will be applying for grants that are available to Charities but not schools, to maximise the range of funders available.



**PayPal** Giving Fund

Easyfundraising allows you to collect free donations while shopping online (including Sainsbury's, Aldi and John Lewis). With PayPal Giving, you can add a small donation to PTFA as your chosen Charity every time you checkout with PayPal.

Your Donation £10 £12.50 iftaid it

As a charity, we can claim **GiftAid** on all donations (not sales) made by UK tax payers which enables us to collect an extra 25% of the donated amount at no extra cost to you. That means, we can turn every £10 donation into a £12.50 donation.







We run ticketed fundraising events throughout the year where we serve refreshments (cash and card), collect donations (cash and card) and give guests the opportunity to signup to be a Cost-foa-Coffee Suppoter. When we provide this for school performances, all donations and profit go directly to that department. So, if we are supporting a dance production, dance will receive all the proifit from refreshment sales and any donations taken at that event.

In addition to raising money for our own Charity, we also raise money for other Charities. Last year, we raised money for Macmillan Cancer Support, the Turkey/Syria Earthquake Appeal with Save the Children and War Child.

**Tech for Tallis 2023** aims to address the ongoing need for laptops across the year groups to ensure that students who are not able to access technology away from School are not digitally excluded from educational opportunities.

We are working with the Senior Leadership Team and ComputerAid to source free and reduced cost reconditioned laptops.

2. Engaging in activities or providing facilities or equipment which support the school and advance the education of the pupils




As part of our work to ensure our Constitution aligns with our Activities, these are our aims for this year.
